By car: Arrive in Via Grande and go straight ahead until you reach Piazza della Repubblica, keep straight into Viale Italia; and then into Viale Giose Carducci until Piazza Dante; at the roundabout follow the sign to Via degli Acquedotti and turn right into Via Frida Misul; continue towards Fonti del Corallo.

By bus: Walk until Via Grande; from GRANDE 4 bus stop take LAM ROSSA BUS (towards Stazione Centrale), get off at STAZIONE CENTRALE B bus stop. Walk until Fonti del Corallo using the underpass of the Central Station.

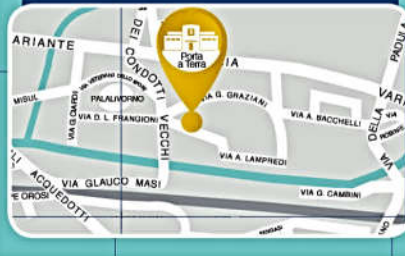
By car: From Piazza del Pamiglione go straight ahead until Piazza Mazzini; at the roundabout keep straight into Viale Italia; once you get at Barriera Regina Margherita, turn left into Viale Nazario Sauro; keep straight into Viale Boccazolo; at the roundabout follow the exit to Parco Levante.

By bus: Walk until Via Grande; from GRANDE 3 bus stop take LAM ROSSA BUS (towards La Leocia/Montenero/Miramare), get off at ARDENZA-CIMITIERI MISERICORDIA bus stop. Walk until Parco Levante.

By car: From Piazza del Pamiglione go straight until Piazza Mazzini; at the roundabout take the first exit on the right and follow Viale Nazario Sauro.

By bus: Walk until Via Grande; from GRANDE 5 bus stop take LAM BLU BUS (towards Ardenza Mare/Miramare) and get off at MAZZINI bus stop.

On foot: From Piazza Santa Trinita (Varco Forzezza) southward passing over Santa Trinita Bridge - Piazza del Pamiglione; go past Scalfi Cialdini, once you get in Piazza Mazzini your destination is on the right.

Livorno and the Grand Duchy of Tuscany



The maritime history of Livorno dates back to the Renaissance, when it was the port of the Grand Duchy of Tuscany. Livorno has always been the crossroads of the Mediterranean Sea routes as well as the gateway to Tuscany. The surrounding gentle hills and luxuriant Mediterranean scrubland slope down to the amazing coastline of the Tyrrhenian Sea, where the enchanting islands of the Tuscan archipelago lie. Moreover, the most famous art cities and beaches of the region are just a few kilometers away from the port.

Born as a melting pot of cultures and traditions, Livorno has got a friendly and welcoming population. The Little Venice is a seafaring district, where a maze of canals flows among the elegant 17th century villas of the wealthy middle-class traders, and is located between two imposing Medicean Fortresses.

Livorno is also rich in monumental cemeteries and churches of different beliefs, which indeed witness the historical openness to other cultures. The Sanctuary of Montenero is reachable by a picturesque funicular and overlooks the town.

The seafarer promenade runs from the town centre to the cliffs of Romito, where the water is crystal clear and the landscapes are really breath-taking.

Not to be missed, the lively markets, rich in smells, colours and voices. Livorno is also Modigliani and Mascagni's birthplace, as well as the culinary home of a tasty seafood cuisine, which contributes to make it an absolutely attractive destination.

Bolgheri and the Wine Route



Travelling along the Roman "Emilia" and "Aurelia" consular roads we reach sites of great historic, scenic and gastronomic interest. The "Etruscan Coast Wine and Olive Oil Route" gives travelers the opportunity to discover fine wines and olive oils and visit medieval towns like Collesalvetti, Rosignano, Montecosaro, Guardistallo, Castellina, Bibbona, Casale before continuing on to Castagneto and San Vincenzo and finally reaching Sassetta, Monteverdi, Campiglia, Suvereto and Piombino at the southern edge of Livorno province.

The suggestive avenue of secular cyresses made immortal by the poet Giosuè Carducci's rhymes, leads from San Guido to Bolgheri, a delightful medieval village in the heart of the Wine Route. Bolgheri has preserved its original layout and buildings, although these have now become craft and workshops, restaurants and wine stores.

A short distance away on the hillside is Castagneto Carducci, an enchanting village of Etruscan origin. From here you can admire the splendid view of the olive groves, vineyards and Mediterranean woods which slope gently down to the sea. This is a noble and ancient area where you can find producers of some of the most prestigious wines in the world. One of these is Sassicaia that has become a symbol of unerring Tuscan excellence and has helped to make this area the cradle of superlative Italian oenology. Here you can enjoy traditional culinary delights and olive oil and drink a great variety of wines with their refined taste and unique character.

The Etruscans and the Northern Maremma



Just a few kilometers south of Livorno is the beautiful countryside of Northern Maremma, which stretches from the village of Castagneto Carducci down to the edge of the region, combining together great environmental, cultural and culinary wealth. The valley is framed by the metal-bearing hills where the Wine Route winds, while along the coast long strips of sand give way to rocky cliffs by the town of Piombino.

Campiglia Marittima is a medieval village whose history is closely linked to the rich mines which can indeed be visited in San Silvestro Archaeology and Mining Park, an open-air museum witnessing man's exploitation of the mineral resources of the area from the Etruscan times to nowadays.

San Vincenzo is a renowned seaside resort town from whose southern edge the impressive Baratti Gulf charmingly spreads out. The stronghold of Populonia overlooks the bay and hosts an archaeological park preserving most of the Etruscan necropolis and artifacts unearthed nearby. Further south, the port town of Piombino, known for its iron and steel mills, unexpectedly impresses for its art and history, while Suvereto and Sassetta are two inland charming villages where to "get lost" in the picturesque narrow streets.

Elba Island and the pearls of the Tyrrhenian sea



Elba Island is the largest "pearl" of the Tuscan archipelago. National Park, which can be easily reached by a short ferry trip from the port of Piombino. Its strategic position, as well as its territory rich in vineyards, crops and minerals, has determined the history of the island, while its fine-grained sand beaches, seaside cliffs, its crystal clear water teeming with fish and plants make it a rightful popular destination. The most populated town of the island, Portoferraio, lies right in the middle of the North coastal stretch, nicely snuggled in a sheltered cove from which the iron to be worked was once embarked to Populonia. The Medici family converted the settlement into a military stronghold which is still preserved, and a naval base to defend the island against pirates. In the upper part of the town is the villa, which now hosts a museum, where Napoleon Bonaparte spent his exile.

Among the beauties that the Tuscan archipelago boasts besides Elba are Capraia, with its clean water, its Mediterranean sea and its seabed rich in natural treasures and archeological ruins, the rocky and lush Gorgona, where the green of the pines meets the deep blue sea, and Pianosa, which gets its name from plain territory, with its remains of the ancient Roman villas.

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
